



Fly Fishing Information

We are located along the Gros Ventre River, which provides for two miles of beautiful, private-water fishing. The river is primarily made up of cutthroat trout but is also home to some rainbows, cutbows and white fish, all of which are non-stocked. We also have two private ponds, stocked with cutthroat trout. Both the river and ponds can be accessed entirely by foot. Our fishing guide works full-time and provides two casting clinics on Mondays, as well as two half-day trips on the Gros Ventre on Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Please note that there is no guided fishing on Wednesday. Whether you are an avid fly fisherman, want to brush up on your skills or have never wet a line to water in your life, we can tailor a fishing experience for you!

***Please note that the fishing on the Gros Ventre River is walk/wade fishing over uneven and rocky ground.

What We Provide:

- 5 weight Orvis fly rods and reels with leaders. If fishing independently, reels must be checked out in the office.
- 3,4,5, and 6X Tippet
- Silicone Float
- A small selection of flies (\$2.25 charge per fly)
- A full time guide for our private section of the Gros Ventre

What to Bring:

- A pair of shorts/pants you don't mind getting wet
- A pair of shoes you don't mind getting wet (we recommend river shoes such as Keen's, Chaco's, Teva's, etc.)
- A fishing license (licenses can be purchased online and then printed from the ranch or purchased at numerous fly shops in Jackson and Moose and are \$14.00 per day of fishing)
- Sunglasses (Polarized preferred, but regular sunglasses will work as well)
- Light Rain Jacket

What to Bring (Optional):

- Waders (light to medium weight recommended, although waders are not necessary, especially in the months of July and August)
- Flies - While we provide a small selection of flies, you may bring your own if you wish. Flies can be purchased at the Orvis, Jack Dennis and Snake River Angler fly shops in Jackson and the Snake River Angler fly shop in Moose. We recommend the following:
 - Hoppers (brown, orange and yellow patterns)
 - Adam's
 - Caddis flies
 - Stimulators (ants, water bugs, spiders)
 - Nymphs (the flashier the better!)
 - Anything else you're curious to try

- Rods – If you wish to bring your own rod, feel free to do so. A 5 weight rod is the standard for rivers in the region, however, 4 and 6 weight rods are perfectly acceptable.
